President's Post July 2024

More good news! The Club's Project Management Committee has been successful with an application submitted to Alcoa for funding of our Clubhouse Upgrade Project. Alcoa have agreed to provide the Club with \$60,000 over three years towards the construction of the clubhouse upgrade works.

This is a massive boost for the project taking the total of funds committed to \$450,000, and will ensure that the project will proceed with the first stage of construction in 2025.

Alcoa are also keen on establishing an ongoing relationship with the Club, including making their staff volunteer program resources available for course & facilities maintenance. I am optimistic that this will provide an opportunity to assist our fantastic band of volunteers with the huge amount of work that is required to keep our course in first class condition.

The Project Management Committee are currently working on the application to be submitted to the Community Sport & Recreation Facilities Fund, with the process about 50% complete. The application will be submitted to the Shire next month and then in turn submitted to the State Government at the end of September. The committee remain confident that the application for an additional \$280,000 will be successful.

With the Alcoa commitment confirming the viability of the Clubhouse Upgrade Project, the Management Committee will need to appoint a project manager as soon as possible, being a mandatory condition of the CSRFF. I will be making myself available to take on this role if appointed, however in doing so I will not be able to continue as the Club's president. I have flagged this move a couple of times and it is now time for the members to consider who they wish to take up the president's role. And while thinking about that it is also necessary for the Club to consider who may be suitable to take on the role of secretary with Peter Townsend advising he will not seek re-nomination at the next AGM.

There are many good things happening around the Club and we are heading into times of some significant changes. I urge all our members to look at how they can expand their involvement in the bright future of the Club.


