President's Post September 2024

Winter is officially over but it looks like the rain is going to continue! The weather has certainly presented challenges for our grounds volunteers, but they have worked diligently to keep the course playable as much as possible. The weather has also had a big impact on our competitions and numbers participating. We have had to reschedule the men's championship in October as the conditions on the scheduled first round were unplayable. The ladies' championships have also been hit with difficult playing conditions, but they have battled on with their championships.

When the weather has been favourable, we have had very good turnouts with 44 players in this month's men's monthly mug.

Things are starting to fall into place with our management executive positions that are becoming vacant at this year's AGM. We have received nominations for President and Secretary which is very pleasing. We hope to be able to advise you of the candidates very soon. We are always looking for others to join our management committee or sub-committees, so if this could be you, please get on board. It would be good to get some fresh ideas into the Club management and to give those who have worked for many years on these committees a well-deserved break.

The Clubhouse Upgrade project continues to pick up momentum with the following developments taking place recently;

The Development Approval (Planning Approval) application submitted to the shire.

Consultants carried out an assessment of our existing site service and prepared a report on any upgrade works required. The outcome of this assessment indicated that the amounts allowed for in our project budget will be sufficient to cover this work.

A civil consultant has carried out a geotechnical assessment of the site, and we will receive a report on this soon.

A structural engineer has been appointed to carry out preliminary structural design work for the footings, slabs, wall and roof framing.

Discussions with a local builder has resulted in some changes to our new roof design to reduce the cost of the structural steel.

The shire officers have prepared a report that recommends that the Council support our application to the state government for funding (\$280K) and this will be presented to the Council Meeting on the 16^{th of} September. The shire is also proposing to increase their funding by \$5K, bringing their commitment to \$210K.

The Project Management Group (Club & Shire reps) will meet on the 24^{th of} September to plan the next stages of the project.

If you haven't done it already, please have a gander at our new website – it's a ripper!

And we now have added the fixtures to menu options. If you can't find your fixture book you can now find it all on the website. And the video flyovers and other photographs of the course will be upgraded as soon as we get some sunny weather.


