Clubhouse Upgrade Project Latest News

Updated Cost Estimates

The Club has received an updated estimate of construction costs from the builder. This shows that the estimated cost of the project has increased significantly, which is due to large increases in building material prices and sub-contractor costs. These figures are estimates only and have not been confirmed by actual quotes, and some savings are possible if competitive quotes can be obtained.

The increase in project costs is being addressed with the following actions;

- Approaching stakeholders to increase their funding commitments. This includes the SJ Shire and Alcoa.
- Considering savings from reductions in the scope of work and the selection of materials and finishes.
- Obtaining quotes from suppliers and sub-contractors that include discounts/savings for the Club.
- Continued negotiations with the builder regarding margins and rates.

Obtain an assessment of the builder's estimates from an independent building estimator.

Whilst this development is not ideal, we are confident that the viability of the project will be retained.

Temporary Clubhouse & Storage Container


The Club has purchased a 20ft sea container to be temporarily located on site. This will be used to house all the existing furniture, fittings, fixtures and loose items contained within our clubhouse lounge, kitchen, captain's office and storeroom.

The footings have been installed for the temporary clubhouse building.

The structure will be moved onto the footings soon and the building set up ready for use.

Architectural Documentation

Work has continued on the preparation of architectural documentation including the internal fit-out details and detailed floor plans and elevations. These will be reviewed by various Club committees before being issued for construction.
