Clubhouse Upgrade Project Latest News

New Effluent Disposal System

At last!!!! Great News!!!!! We have finally received approval from the WA Dept of Heath for our effluent disposal system after a delay of about 4 months. This will allow the project to proceed as soon as possible.

Unfortunately, to obtain the approval, we have had to significantly increase the size and cost of the system which will now comprise a 6000L pre day ATU and 2 x 18m leach drains. This will certainly future proof the system to cope with any potential increase in the size or use of the clubhouse, and give the club the ability to host large events over multiple days – such as the men's WA Sand Greens Championship.

The cost of the system will be around \$70,000 which is \$50,000 more than allowed for in the project budget, and therefore we will need to source some additional project funding.

The work on the new effluent disposal system will commence before the end of 2025.

Additional Shire Funding

The request for additional funding from the shire has not made it onto the agenda for the November council meeting. This will allow us to make an alteration to the request by increasing the amount to cover the larger than anticipated increase in the cost of the effluent disposal system. It is anticipated that the funding request will be dealt with at a council meeting early in 2026.

Temporary Clubhouse & Toilets

With the WA Dept of Health approval, we will be moving the Club's competition and social administration into the temporary facilities after the Summer Ambrose Day on the 29th of November.

The repair works on the temporary toilets building will commence very soon but will not be commissioned until the new effluent disposal system is completed.

Access will remain in place to our existing toilet facilities via the external door until the temporary toilets are in use.

Security Fencing & Demolition

The builder, Build Construct Renovate (BCR), will be installing temporary security fencing around the building site once we have moved into the temporary clubhouse. This will allow demolition works to commence in December, which will initially involve the verandah structure and the non-structural components of the clubhouse.

Building Permit Application

BCR have been preparing the various components of the building permit application, which includes energy efficiency and bushfire attack level (BAL) assessments. This will be then processed by BCR's building certifiers before being submitted to the shire. This should allow the construction to commence in early 2026.

Project Funding
