The club finished the 2025 year in a very buoyant financial position due mostly to the astute work of the Treasurer Fred Cox. As we move into 2026 however there is some anticipated high expenditures particularly with the Clubhouse Upgrade and Reticulation Upgrade works commencing in earnest.

Latest News

• Effluent Disposal System (ATU)

We have received approval from the WA Dept of Health for our effluent disposal system (ATU) and have attended a meeting with shire health officers to confirm the requirements of this approval plus the shire's approval requirements.

At this meeting the shire officers gave verbal approval to vary the requirements provided by the WA Dept of Health, with the total length of flatbed leach drains reduced from 36m to 32m. Whilst this is a 'win' in some ways it is also frustrating to find that after a 3 month delay to the project getting the WA Dept of Health approval only to learn that the shire can overrule their conditions of approval.

The contractor for the ATU has order the equipment and will commence work on the installation in late January 2026. The ATU should be completed by the end of March and the temporary toilets connected soon after allowing the demolition of the existing toilets and the remaining clubhouse.

• Demolition Works

Members of the Club have been working on the preliminary demolition of the old clubhouse, including the patio and rear section of the lounge area, captain's office and storeroom. A massive thanks to all those who were able to help.



• Main Construction Works

The contracts have been finalized for stage 1 of the upgraded Clubhouse (up to lock-up) and will be signed this month. The head contractor, Build Construct Renovate (BCR) has completed the preliminary work required to submit for a building permit. This work includes Certification of the contract drawings assessment of the Energy efficiency, Bushfire Attack Level rating and plan.

The contractor has installed security fencing around the southern section of the building where the demolition work has commenced.

• Additional Shire Funding

The SJ Shire is holding a Council Concept Forum on the 4th Feb 2026 to consider the Club's request for an additional \$50,000 of funding for our project. The shire officers have been working with us preparing a report for this meeting and our request will hopefully receive a positive response.
